Contestants in the Buc Days Clays 4-H Shoot are responsible for knowing and complying with all rules of this competition.



- 1. **Participation**: This is a shotgun shooting competition. This competition will be limited to the first 160 entries based on age and their correlating Open Age Divisions:
  - a. Junior Open Division (3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> graders only)
  - b. Intermediate Open Division (6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders only)
  - c. Senior 1 Open Division (9th and 10th graders only)
  - d. Senior 2 Open Division (11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders only)

National Skeet Shooting Association and National Sporting Clay Association governing body rules will apply, unless superseded by the Buc Days Clays 4-H Shoot Special Rules. All entries in this competition are subject to the rules that follow.

- 2. Eligibility: Participation in the Buc Days Clays 4-H Shoot is limited to TX resident students, who are members of a TX 4-H Club. Exhibitors must be United States citizens and possess a valid social security number to be eligible for participation in the event. Exhibitors must be enrolled in, and attending, public or private elementary or secondary schools in TX. Students must be between the ages of 8 (in addition to being in the 3rd grade) and 18 on or before August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Each 4-H Club member must be in good standing with its state and National affiliates. Involvement in international or national events does NOT disqualify otherwise eligible shooters.
  - a. Junior Open Division Participant Classification 8 years of age (in addition to being in the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade) and not over 10 years of age as of August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
  - b. **Intermediate Open Division Participant Classification** 10 years of age (in addition to being in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade) and not over 14 years of age as of August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
  - c. **Senior 1 Open Division Participant Classification** 14 years of age (in addition to being in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade) and not over 16 years of age as of August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
  - d. **Senior 2 Open Division Participant Classification** 16 years of age (in addition to being in the 11<sup>th</sup> grade) and not over 18 years of age as of August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
  - e. Contestants also must have competed in the 2023 4-H State Games to enter the Buc Days Clays 4-H Shoot:
  - f. A contestant is not eligible if already graduated from high school.
- 3. **Ineligible Exhibitors**: 4-H members are eligible by the Buccaneer Commission for participation in the event at the time that entries are received. Any CEA (County Extension Agent) who has a member who becomes ineligible to participate, for any reason, must provide written and signed notification to the appropriate Superintendent at least 24 hours prior to the commencement of any activity in which the ineligible exhibitor was to participate. If an exhibitor is determined ineligible, then the entry is ineligible.
  - a. Foreign Exchange Students: Non-United States citizens and Foreign Exchange students are ineligible to compete in the Buc Days Clays 4-H Shoot. All contestants must be United States citizens and possess a valid social security number to be eligible for participation in the event.
- 4. **Exhibitor Code of Ethics**: The Buc Days Clays 4-H Shoot is a family-friendly event. As such, an individuals' conduct as an exhibitor or patron should be exemplary, and violators are subject to disqualification or removal from the Corpus Christi Gun Club grounds.
  - a. Violations include, but are not limited to:
    - i. Disruptive or improper conduct



- ii. Public display of profanity of any sort
- iii. Violence of any sort
- iv. Providing alcohol to underage persons or providing a space for the consumption of alcohol by underage persons
- v. Possession, use, or distribution of alcohol by underage persons
- vi. Possession of an open alcohol container in a public area regardless of the individual's age
- vii. Excessive consumption of alcohol

#### 5. Rules of Entry:

- a. **Entry Requirements:** The right is reserved, by management, to reject entirely or accept conditionally any entry and to refuse any accepted entry admittance to the grounds or Corpus Christi Gun Club (CCGC).
  - i. Entries are limited to the first 160 entries entered. No waitlist will be offered.
  - ii. Verification will be confirmed with the CEA (County Extension Agent) to validate that each participant is enrolled in Texas 4-H at the time of entry.
    - a. Should we not receive enrollment notice in a timely manner, the Buccaneer Commission will require the participants assistance to obtain that information.
- b. Classes:
  - i. **Junior Open Division Participant Classification** 8 years of age (in addition to being in the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade) and not over 10 years of age as of August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
  - ii. **Intermediate Open Division Participant Classification** 10 years of age (in addition to being in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade) and not over 14 years of age as of August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
  - iii. **Senior 1 Open Division Participant Classification** 14 years of age (in addition to being in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade) and not over 16 years of age as of August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
  - iv. **Senior 2 Open Division Participant Classification** 16 years of age (in addition to being in the 11<sup>th</sup> grade) and not over 18 years of age as of August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
- c. Entry Format: Entry will open by October 15th, 2023 and will close when the maximum entry limit is reached. Each entry will consist of their qualifying events for Sporting Clays (100 targets) and American Skeet (50 targets). Event entry fees will be \$185.00. No refunds will be given after January 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024, unless participant is deemed ineligible, in which a full refund will be granted.
  - i. Everyone will select to compete on Saturday (February 24th, 2024) in both American Skeet and Sporting Clays and the top 5 participants in each Open Age Division (20 total) will continue to the Championship Round on Sunday, February 25th, 2024 for the opportunity to win prize money and scholarships.
  - ii. At the time of entry, you will select your Sporting Clays Flight which will determine the Skeet Rotations available to you as listed below.
    - a. 9:00am Sporting Clays rotation will be paired with American Skeet Rotations at 1:00pm, 1:45pm, 2:30pm, or 3:15pm
    - b. 1:00pm Sporting Clays rotation will be paired with American Skeet Rotations at 9:00am, 9:45am, 10:30am, 11:15am
- 6. Event Format:
  - a. Qualifying Round:

(Saturday, February 24th, 2024)

- i. The Qualifying Round will consist of 100 Sporting Clays targets and 50 American Skeet targets.
- ii. The total combined score for both qualifying events (Sporting Clays and American Skeet) will be added together for overall placing for each of the Open Age divisions.
  - a. Example of scoring totals:
    - a. If you shot a 95 in Sporting Clays and a 45 in American Skeet your total combined score for placing in your Open Age Division would be 140.
  - b. Example of shooter placing:
    - a. Shooter A shoots 149
    - b. Shooter B and C shoots 147
    - c. Shooters D, E, F, G, H, and I shoot 145.
    - d. Shooters A, B, and C will advance to the Championship Round taking the top 3 spots and shooters D, E, F, G, H, and I will shoot off for the final 2 spots.
- iii. Only the top 5 shooters (20 Total) from each of the Open Age Division will advance to the Championship Round.
- iv. NSCA procedures will be followed for any necessary shoot offs/tie breakers in Sporting Clays.
- v. NSSA procedures will be following for any necessary shoot offs/tie breakers in Skeet.

#### b. Championship Round: (Sunday, February 25th, 2024)

- i. The top five shooters (20 Total) from each of the Open Age Divisions, will advance to the Championship Round on Sunday, February 25th, 2024. The list of shooters who advance to the Championship Round will be announced on Saturday, February 24th, following the final score tabulation and shoot offs if necessary.
- ii. All scores from Saturday's Qualifying Round will not apply during the Sunday, February 4<sup>th</sup>, Championship Round. Each contestant will shoot with a clean slate of scoring.
- iii. Each contestant that has advanced to the Championship Round will compete in Skeet doubles (50 targets) and Whiz Bang (50 targets) for the Championship Round.
- iv. The shooters that advance to the Championship Round must be present and must participate to receive any prize money or scholarship funds.
- v. NSSA and Texas 4-H Whiz Bang procedures will be followed.

#### 7. Shoot offs/ Tie Breakers:

#### a. Qualifying Round (Saturdays Round) shoot off format will be as follows:

- i. Skeet doubles from stations 3/4/5/4/3 (10 Shots)
- ii. Sporting clays (From the 5 Stand Field) 5 pairs from station 2 (10 shots).
- iii. Scores from skeet and 5 stand will be combined, and placings will be established.
- iv. If shooters are still tied, they will shoot the following.
  - a. Sporting clays (From the 5 Stand Field) 5 pairs from station 4 (10 shots)
  - b. Skeet doubles from stations 3/4/5/4/3 (10 Shots)
  - c. Scores from skeet and 5 stand will be combined, and placings will be established.
  - d. If shooters are still tied, they will shoot the following.
    - a. Skeet doubles from stations 3/4/5/4/3 (10 Shots)
    - b. Sporting clays (From the 5 Stand Field) 5 pairs from station 2 (10 shots)

- c. Scores from skeet and 5 stand will be combined, and placings will be established.
- d. If shooters are still tied, they will continue the above rotations until all placings are established.

#### b. Championship Round

- i. NSSA and Texas 4-H Whiz Bang shoot off procedures will be followed for the Championship Round, as well as the same shoot off procedures that are listed for the Qualifying Round.
- ii. All ties, during the Championship Round, shall be shot off unless otherwise specified by shoot management and published in the program or posted at the registration table.
- iii. If shoot-offs are held, the shoot-offs must be held on targets or positions not previously shot by any participating competitor in the Sporting Clay Competition.
- iv. If shoot offs are not possible by conditions, the Buccaneer Commission has the right to use alternative means to determine results.
- v. The Protest Committee will determine final placings, if necessary.
- 8. Check-In: All shooters are required to check in on Saturday, February 24th (7:30am 8:30am) and must be present for the mandatory safety orientation. Shooters will be given credentials in the form of a shooter number at check-in that must always be displayed while shooting (attached to their shooting vest, shirt, outerwear, or shooting pouch). NO LATE ARRIVALS WILL BE ACCEPTED. NO EXPECTIONS!
- 9. Safety Orientations: Safety orientations will be conducted on Saturday, February 24th at 8:30am for the Qualifying Event and Sunday, February 25th at 8:30am for the Championship Round. Safety orientations are mandatory for everyone who will participate in the events that day. Failure to attend the mandatory safety orientation for the Qualifying Round or Championship Round will result in disqualification. NO SPECIAL/ ADDITIONAL ORIENTATIONS WILL BE HELD!
- 10. **Squadding**: Squadding for skeet will be assigned on a random basis, within age divisions. No special request accommodations will be made. Accommodations for siblings will be considered for sporting clays only. Please add sporting clay requests for siblings in the 'comments' section of iClays. Squadding will be posted online at the iClays website after registration is closed. Contestants should check periodically, as updates and changes may be made before the event.

#### 11. Safety Requirements:

- a. **Range Safety**: The safety of all involved is of paramount importance. All range safety rules will be strictly enforced. Any shooter failing to conform to safety standards will be warned of disqualified from the event. Minor infractions will be noted and marked on the shooter's badge. Repeated infractions or major safety violations will result in disqualification from the event.
- b. **Open and Empty**: All firearms will remain open and empty until the shooter is on the shooting station, and it is her/her turn to shoot. The firearm must be open and empty before leaving the shooting station. Over and under' s broken open and semis or pumps must have actions open.
- c. Muzzle Control: Shooters must always maintain safe control of their muzzles. Regardless of condition, muzzles may not be pointed toward or rested upon any part of the body of the shooter or any person. This includes the use of toe pads. The only exception is the limited exposure required in changing chokes. Violation of this rule may result in warning, disqualification from a round, or disqualification from a match.

- d. **Eye Protection**: Shooting glasses or equivalent prescription glasses are required for all events. All persons on any course are required to have eye protection, including range personnel, and shooters. All spectators on the sporting clays course are required to always have eye protection on. Eye protection for spectators watching the skeet events is encouraged to wear eye protection as well.
- e. **Ear Protection**: All persons on any course are required to have hearing protection. Either ear plugs or earmuffs may be worn at the discretion of the shooter, or ranger officer; but proper hearing protection is required. *Electronic devices are not allowed while shooting, this includes cell phones, headsets, electronic watches, Bluetooth devices, or any other form of electronic device. NO EXCEPTIONS.* One set of complimentary ear plugs will be in each shooter packet. Observers should provide their own ear protection. All spectators on the sporting clays course are required to always have hearing protection on. Hearing protection for spectators watching the skeet events are encouraged to wear hearing protection as well.
- f. **Firearms**: Any 12 gauge or smaller fired from the shoulder shotgun, which conforms to NSSA/NSCA rules.
- g. Ammunition: NO RELOADS NSCA PERMITTED FACTORY AMMUNITION ONLY Shooters must furnish their own appropriate ammunition. It is vitally important to allow extra ammunition for shoot-offs, malfunctions, or other contingencies. Ammunition is subject to inspection and verification.
  - i. No load may contain more than 1 1/8 ounces of shot.
  - ii. No load may contain any shot larger than Number 7 1/2
  - iii. All loads must contain lead shot.
- h. **Field and Range Boundaries**: For multiple reasons, control of traffic on and around all fields and ranges is essential. Please respect these boundaries and the directions of the officials.
- i. **Disruption:** Parents, coaches, and other individuals should remain positive and supportive, being careful not to disrupt or exhibit behaviors deemed detrimental to shooters or the operation of the match. Sanctions ranging from warning to ejection from the grounds or disqualification of shooters may be imposed for interference with the operation of the match or disruption of the events on the firing line or field.
- j. **Alcohol Policy**: Alcohol will not be allowed on the grounds of the Corpus Christi Gun Club for this specific event. Consumption, use, and possession of alcohol by persons under the age of 21 is prohibited by law and is not permitted anywhere on the grounds at any time.
- k. **Drug Policy**: Shooting is not allowed while under the influence of any drug or prescription medications that effect judgement and conduct to a degree that a participant is unsafe.
- I. Tobacco Policy: Smoking is not permitted on or near the firing lines or in any area where it would be considered inappropriate or is a situation where the smoke constitutes interference to shooters. Smoking use and possession of tobacco products (including smokeless) by minors is prohibited by law and is not permitted anywhere on the grounds at any time.
- m. **Weather**: Rain or shine, the event will continue unless officials are made aware of lightning in the area. The Corpus Christi Gun Club will make decisions on the suspension and proceeding of the shoot, if needed.
- 12. **Interference**: If any contestant, in any way, whether in person or by agent, or servant, interferes with the judges during their adjudication, or shows disrespect to them, to the show or competition, they are subject to be penalized. Management may demand a proper apology from the contestant, may exclude

him/her from competition, bar him/her from the grounds/ CCGC, and may also withhold any prizes that may have been awarded.

- 13. **Photographs**: All photographs taken by the official photographer become property of the Buccaneer Commission. Unofficial (i.e. personal) photographs may not be published without the written approval of Management. Contestants wishing to purchase photographs must contact the official photographer.
  - a. Commercial photography and filming are often conducted at the Buccaneer Commission. You may be depicted in photographs or video recordings or video recordings of any Buccaneer Commission event, and by entering the grounds/ CCGC and/ or competitive events associated with the Buccaneer Commission, you consent to the use of any depictions in connection with advertising, news reporting, public relations, webcasts or other broadcasts, or any other activities relating to the Buccaneer Commission, and you further release and waive all claims for compensation and any rights of review and approval, copyright, and right of publicity with respect to thereto.
- 14. **Property/Security**: All contestants or persons in charge of property, shall care for, guard, protect, and preserve same, as the Buccaneer Commission and CCGC do not undertake to do so and shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to said property of contestants thereof. All contestants are responsible for security of their own property. The contestant is the absolute insurer of and is responsible for the condition of their property. The Buccaneer Commission are CCGC are not responsible for the acts of a third party.
- 15. **Official Scores**: The official score is the record kept by the referee/scorer on a sheet furnished him/her by Management. The referee/scorer's decision in whether a target is dead or lost is final. All reported scores are checked for accuracy and corrections will be made when required. Shoot officials maintain the objective of producing timely, accurate and complete scoring records for each event. They do not represent any club, county, team, or individual. The Buccaneer Commission Superintendent(s) will be responsible for conducting any and all aspects of the event pertaining to 'shooting'. Including, but not limited to squadding, scoring, posting of scores, determination and conducting shoot-offs, determination of winners, and rule interpretation.
  - i. A Master sheet will be used at each station and will be in possession of the scorer. Scorecards will be carried from station to station by the contestants and should only be written on by the scorer. Parents, coaches, observers should never have possession of the shooter's scorecard. Fabrication of scorecards will result in disqualification from the event, with no possibility of proceeding to the Championship Round or winning prize money/ scholarships.
- 16. **Appeals**: A shooter may appeal a ruling on the field immediately if he/she feels a referee has missed a call. Once the shooter has called for another target, leaves the station, or the next shooter has fired, such right of appeal is lost. The referee may seek assistance from the scorer or may poll the squad at his or her discretion. The decision of the referee on the field is final and not subject to further appeal. Parent/ coach scoring is not official scoring and will not be consulted.
- 17. **Protests**: Shooters may only protest any injustice, violation of the rules, or other circumstance that may have resulted in placing them at a disadvantage relative to other shooters. Such conditions must be

reported to the Superintendent(s) immediately. All protests must be in writing and be accompanied by a \$300 deposit, which will be donated to the Buccaneer Commission if protest is declined. If the protest is granted, the participant will receive a full refund of the \$300 deposit. Protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Show Management immediately after the occasion that prompted the protest. The Protest Jury will investigate and reach final resolution of the matter as soon as possible considering all circumstances. Results of all protests are final and will be reported to the contestant.

- a. Protest Committee will include the Superintendent(s), Assistant Superintendent(s), Director of Competitions at the Buccaneer Commission, and the Corpus Christi Gun Club (CCGC).
- 18. **Accommodations**: Lodging is the responsibility of the shooter's party and will not be arranged by the Buccaneer Commission or the Corpus Christi Gun Club (CCGC).
- 19. **Coaching**: A participant may not be coached while in the shooting box. Coaching includes any communication between the coach, parent or other spectator and the shooter; verbal or non-verbal. The shooter may request assistance from the range safety officer and the range officer may assign an assistant, in the event of a malfunction.
- 20. **Dress Code**: Participants and spectators are required to dress appropriately. Both young people and adults should wear attire that is appropriate for the weather while remaining modest and socially acceptable. Shooters must wear a shirt with sleeves. Clothing deemed immodest or distracting to other shooters will not be permitted. Wearing eye and ear protection is required and fully enclosed shoes must be worn for safety reasons by both shooters and spectators. All shooters and coaches should consider their dress in that they may be having photographs taken or be asked to interview for the media.
- 21. **Use of Two-Way Radios**: To assist us in range and match operations, only authorized persons are permitted to use two-way radios on the grounds. Any action by either or adults interfering with the frequencies in use imposes a safety hazard. Deliberate disruption of range communication by anyone at the event will be considered a safety violation and will be treated as such.
- 22. **Personal Carts**: Cart rentals from CCGC will be available for \$80 per sporting clay round. For more information or to reserve your cart, please contact Corpus Christi Gun Club at (361) 852-1212 or visit <u>www.corpuschristigunclub.com</u>. Contestants are allowed to bring their own buggy or cart for this event. The Corpus Christi Gun Club will have waivers to acknowledge for those who are renting carts. Cart rental deadline is January 26<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

#### 23. Buccaneer Commission Scholarship Requirements (for qualifying Class of 2024 Senior):

\*\*\*If the recipient of the Senior 2 Open Division Scholarship is awarded to an individual in 11<sup>th</sup> grade, these same rules will apply for that individual when retrieving the funds, the following year\*\*\*

\*\*\*Senior 2 Open Division individuals are not limited to one scholarship, meaning a contestant could compete to win the scholarship prize when they are in the 11<sup>th</sup> grade AND when they are in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade\*\*\*

a. Recipient must begin use of Buccaneer Commission Scholarship within six months of graduation from high school.

- b. Recipient must be enrolled as a full-time student at a college, university, trade school or the recipient must show proof of military enrollment. Exceptions will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- c. Recipient must submit the following documents to the Buccaneer Commission at the address below by August 2, 2024:
  - i. Completed Buccaneer Commission Scholarship Contract
  - ii. Thank you letter to Buccaneer Commission
  - iii. Class Schedule for Fall 2024 Semester, substantiating semester hour requirements (i.e., class schedule with total hour reflected)
  - iv. Upon meeting all requirements for scholarship disbursement, scholarships will be paid directly to the college, university, or trade school designated by the recipient as follows: Disbursement of Scholarship Amounts: 50% of total scholarship provided for Fall 2024 / 50% of total scholarship provided for Spring 2025.
  - v. If the recipient is not attending a college, university, or trade school but has enlisted in the military, payment will be provided after six months of military training/ activity has been completed. Documentation in the form of military service documents, orders, or payroll/ tax records with dates will be required to receive the funds.
  - vi. Failure to fully comply with Buccaneer Commission Scholarship Policies will result in forfeiture of scholarship funds.
  - vii. Should a recipient not attend college, or fail to maintain academic standards or college enrollment, the balance of the scholarship will be forfeited to the Buccaneer Commission Scholarship Program.
  - viii. Any exceptions to these rules must be requested in writing by the Recipient and approved in writing by the Buccaneer Commission.
  - ix. The Buccaneer Commission reserves the right to interpret or amend these rules and requirements at any time at its discretion and to settle and determine all disputes, questions or matters regarding, arising from or incident to the Scholarship Program, including but not limited to revocation of a scholarship.
- 24. Awards: The following prizes will be awarded to each Open Age Division (Junior, Intermediate, Senior 1, & Senior 2) to the top 5 individuals from the Championship Round that will be held on Sunday, February 25<sup>th</sup> to compete for a grand total of \$25,000 in prize money and scholarships. ONLY, the total combined scores (Skeet doubles 50 targets and Whiz Bang 50 targets) from the Sunday Championship Round will determine the following award placings. Shoot offs will be conducted if necessary to determine the final top 5 placings for each of the Open Age Divisions.
  - a. A total of \$3,000 will be awarded to the Junior Open Division (3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> graders).
    - i. 1<sup>st</sup> place- \$1,000 prize money
    - ii. 2<sup>nd</sup> place- \$800 prize money
    - iii. 3<sup>rd</sup> place- \$600 prize money
    - iv. 4<sup>th</sup> place- \$400 prize money
    - v. 5<sup>th</sup> place- \$200 prize money
  - b. A total of \$4,000 will be awarded to the Intermediate Open Division (6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders).
    - i. 1<sup>st</sup> place- \$1,200 prize money
    - ii. 2<sup>nd</sup> place- \$1,000 prize money
    - iii. 3<sup>rd</sup> place- \$800 prize money

- iv. 4<sup>th</sup> place-\$600 prize money
- 5<sup>th</sup> place-\$400 prize money v.
